TABERNACLE CONSECRATION

At the beginning of Mass this Sunday, Father Patrick will consecrate our newlyrestored tabernacle, which had been in storage for about 50 years. The tabernacle was restored as part of the church interior renovations, which included the installation of a new altar, tabernacle table, baptism font and ambo (pulpit), and painting of our patron, Saint Martin.

This work, along with planned exterior repairs, is being funded through our Parish Improvement Fund — supported by the Summer Festival & BBQ, Holiday Fair and 120 Club — and the "Support Our Historic Church" capital campaign. Thank you to those who have already contributed to this restoration campaign. To date, \$1,693 has been donated.
